

**HASWELL FARMS/THE ENCLAVE**  
**TRAFFIC CALMING – Work Plan**

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**Meet with Neighborhood Representatives to Discuss Concern/Problem (September/October 2013)**

- Haswell Farms HOA representatives
- The Enclave representatives

**Define, Measure, Analyze Traffic Problem (November/December 2013)**

- Review/summarize enforcement data
  - Speeding and Failure to Stop Tickets issued
- Install Automatic Traffic Recorders (ATRs) to collect vehicle volume and speed data
  - Identify location(s)
  - Contract with CHA companies (CHA) to install ATRs
  - CHA to review ATR data and summarize
- Define the general transportation and land use characteristics of the study area
  - Accident data, emergency service routes, school transportation routes, etc.
- Conduct a preliminary assessment of the relative magnitude of the problem
- Compare volume, speed, and ticket data to best practice threshold values (indicators of an acceptable range)
- Verify conditions are within ranges where traffic calming strategies may be applicable (based on best practice research)

**Community Announcement/Information (December 2013)**

- Prepare and submit letter to Haswell Farms and Enclave residents. Letter (from Supervisor and Police Chief) to include:
  - Identification of /concern/problem. Emphasize data collected and safety concerns.
  - Safety concern identified by neighborhood residents
  - Encourage residents to obey the speed limit when traveling through the neighborhoods
  - Encourage residents to sign the ROLL Model pledge
  - Announce neighborhood meeting for discussion and solutions that are data drive.

**Neighborhood Meeting #1 (December 2013/ January 2014)**

- Discuss the problem – present data that was collected
- Identify goals and objectives that improve safety and quality of life issues.
- Identify potential solutions, including physical alterations such as trees, temporary speed humps, signage, etc.

**Select Solutions (January 2014)**

- Town Staff and Neighborhood representatives discuss solutions/select best solutions utilizing neighborhood meeting feedback. For example:
  - Increased enforcement (frequency)
  - Speed Trailers
  - Traffic calming public education strategies - newspaper reports of issue and speed limit enforcement
  - Physical alterations (e.g. trees, temporary speed humps, signage, etc.)

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**Implement Solutions (January 2014 – April 2014)**

- Implement solutions

**Performance Measurements (May 2014 – June 2014)**

- Evaluate/measure the results of the education campaign and solutions
  - Reinstall ATRs – document vehicle speeds/volume
  - Enforcement – document vehicle speeding tickets issued

**Neighborhood Meeting #2 (July 2014)**

- Review results of plan solutions
- Activate controls that assure continue plan success
